### **IN MEMORIAM**

It is with great sadness that we report the deaths of four College Fellows over the past month.

**Howard M. Snyder, III, MD**, died on June 4, 2020 from complications due to COVID-19. Dr. Snyder was a pioneer in pediatric urology. He had been a Fellow of the College since 1981, serving as Board Trustee, Board Treasurer, and Chair of the Admissions Committee for many years.

**Edward Jaeger, MD**, died on June 11, 2020 and had been a Fellow since 1967. Among other accomplishments, Dr. Jaeger was a dedicated educator and was Director of Undergraduate Education in Ophthalmology at Jefferson for 35 years.

**Wolfram Rieger, MD**, died on June 23, 2020. Dr. Rieger, who practiced psychiatry in Philadelphia for more than 50 years, became a Fellow in 1983. He recently attended College Night to celebrate the Fall 2019 inductees, including the induction of a Fellow he sponsored, Stephen A. Ryan, JD. Mr. Ryan, a dear friend of Dr. Rieger, informed us of the sad news.

**Berton "Bert" E. Korman** died on July 1, 2020. Mr. Korman was Chair of Korman Residential Properties, founded by his family in 1919. He was also involved in many civic and cultural institutions throughout Philadelphia. Mr. Korman became a Fellow in 2001, serving on the Board of Trustees from 2002 to 2012, and was active on several committees.


